A while ago we all received a survey from the Shire of Northam seeking our input as to how safe we feel in our Homes, and in the Shire generally.

In the 1950s life was much easier going, and with neighbors' on both sides and the back with low picket fences or wire netting to all sides so everyone could see in each other's back yards. Doors and windows were all left open without concern for anyone breaking in and entering.

One of my neighbors, Mr. M Carter was employed as a lines man for the Telegraph, and worked long hard hours away from home for the small remuneration he received. After he retired, in 1959, he had time to do the much needed jobs around the home. Merv had a small area of lawn out the front and was intent on keeping neat; lawn was a luxury in those times. Merv had a push lawn mower and to do the edges he used a hand shear as used by the shearers of that time. Trimming the edges of the lawn on hands and knees was very difficult for him.

One day while shopping down town he saw a machine in a store window that would make his life a lot easier, it was a petrol lawn edger. The store keeper said if he put down a small deposit and make monthly payments he could take it home. Merv did the Hire purchase contract and was greatly relieved that he would no longer have to suffer the pain in his knees when he trimmed the lawn edges by hand. The lawn edger lived up to his expectations and he told all his neighbors of his fantastic lawn edger. One day after mowing his lawn he brought out his edger to finish the lawn of. At that moment his wife called him in for a cuppa tea and he leant the lawn edger against the fence and went out the back to have a cuppa tea with his wife. Fifteen minutes later he returned to his lawn and the edger was gone. He thought that one of his neighbors was playing a trick on him, as he was a bit of a larrikin, and asked all his neighbors if they had seen his lawn edger, nobody had seen it, and everyone was in disbelief that the edger was stolen. The next day, reluctantly, Merv went to the police station to report the lawn edger stolen. To his surprise the police officer said that he had a long list of items that were missing or stolen. Merv was astounded that there was so much crime in Northam.

Another time more recent, an elderly lady in a house across the road who lived alone with her dog for company, was asleep in her bedroom and was awakened by her dog growling and barking, she woke up to the commotion and then heard a rattling at the window which was half open to let in some air as it was in the middle of summer. There at the window was someone trying to get in. she quickly got up and slammed the window shut. After reporting the incident to the police, she was admonished for being so foolish as to leave the window open, and told her to lock up all the windows and doors before she goes to bed.
