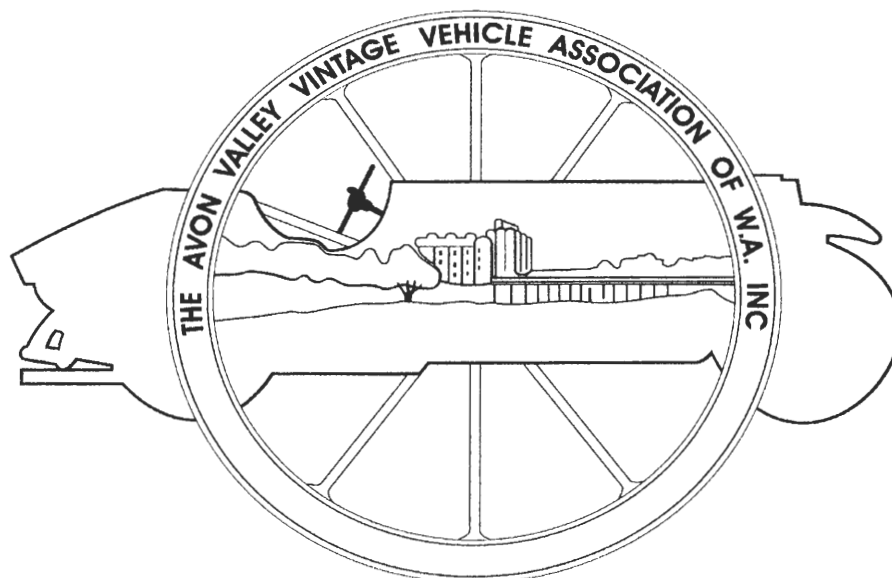

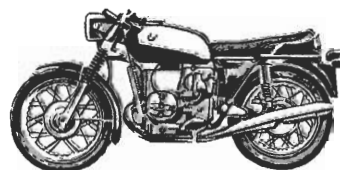

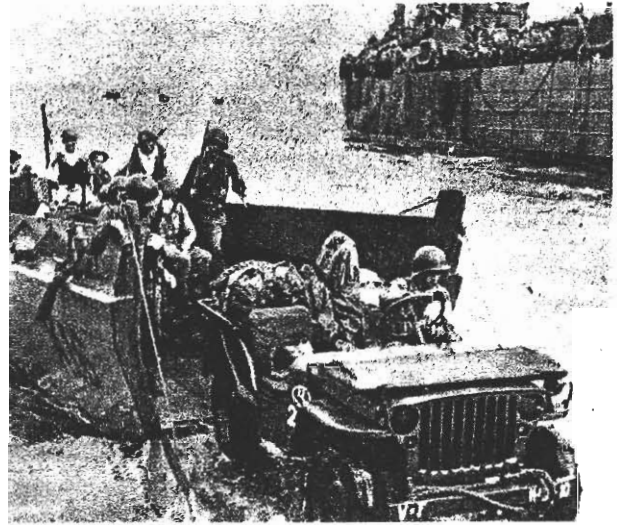
The “JEEP”

The following very interesting article was supplied by Theo Bekkers

In 1940 after the invasion of Austria, Czechoslovakia and Poland, Germany unleashed her armed forces on Belgium and my own country, Holland. Both countries being small, each did not have the military capacity to ward off invasion and within weeks both countries submitted to the oppressive rule of the Nazi's for the next four years.



It was not until 1944 that the allies were able to launch an invasion of the continent with British, Canadian and troops from the United States of America. As part of this invasion these armies brought with them a vast array of equipment, amongst which was a small four-wheeled vehicle known affectionately as the “Jeep”, a name apparently derived from a character in a Popeye cartoon. What this little vehicle could do was amazing. It could be used on any terrain whether it be dry land or mud. It could leap obstacles in a single bound, carry a machine gun and four troops, carry the wounded on stretchers and even be able to be used under water with the aid of a snorkel. As the allies moved forward and into my own country of Holland and I first saw this amazing little vehicle, I was determined to one day be the owner of such a vehicle.



It was some years later after I had migrated to Australia and had restored three early model vehicles that I once again recalled my dream of owning the legendary Jeep. When I was able to bring my dream to reality I found that the current owners of Jeeps were reluctant to part with them until, one day, I came across an article in a motoring magazine that a partly restored Jeep was for sale. After a telephone call and a trip to the city, a deal was made and I was the proud owner of the legend. The next job was to complete the restoration and some months later my Jeep was complete with all the wartime attachments including a shovel and the .303 rifle.

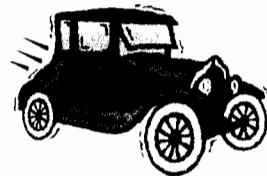

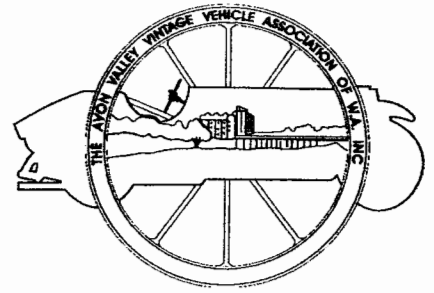
